Introduction

- Examine how data and factual comparisons between decades strengthen logical appeal.
- Show how statistics clarify the urgency of climate change.

Conclusion

- Restate the thesis in new words to reinforce the argument.
- Reflect on how emotional and rational appeals work together to motivate the audience toward action.
